Kohlrabi
 the
 "Cabbage Turnip"

This funny little vegetable is easy to grow and quick to mature, yet somehow most gardens have never grown -or tasted- this member of the cabbage family. The name come from the German words kohl (cabbage) and rabi (turnip). Available in dazzling shades of lime green, bright purple, and creamy white, it is a delightful addition to any garden.

The edible part is a rounded stem that sits on top of the ground. These colorful orbs are harvested when they're about 3 inches across and can be eaten raw or cooked. Kohlrabi is crisp, juicy, and sweet, with a faint celery or radishlike flavor. The leaves taste mildly like cabbage.

Plant kohlrabi in early spring in a cold frame or under a mini hoop tunnel, or in the open garden a few weeks before the last spring frost. In late summer, a fall crop can be planted in the garden and cold frames for a cold-season harvest.



Salad greens and cabbage family members like broccoli, kohlrabi, kale, and mustard thrive with plenty of nitrogen for optimal growth.
